

## Emergency Outdoor Dining Rules

Privately Owned Parking Lots	Shared Parking Lots
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• May use approximately 25% of parking spaces.</li> <li>• Temporary space must be as close to the building as possible.</li> <li>• Must have some type of barrier between cars and seating spaces, such as: Snow fence, planters with rope or chain, cones with rope or chain, or plastic A-frame barriers.</li> <li>• The temporary space must meet ADA standards:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Guests must have access to restroom facilities.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• If business has a liquor license an updated insurance certificate identifying newly expanded premises on file with the City.</li> <li>• Must follow current state occupancy regulations available on the Stay Safe MN Website.</li> <li>• Tents are not permitted.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Written Permission from Property Owner is required.</li> <li>• May use up to 4 parking spaces for each business.</li> <li>• We encourage neighboring restaurants/bars to create a common shared space where possible (to minimize the number of ramps needed for ADA accessibility).               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Each space must be designated for each restaurant/bar.</li> <li>○ Must follow current state occupancy regulations available on the Stay Safe MN Website.</li> <li>○ If a common space is created, the business owners must submit written plan, signed by all owners, that describes the proposed shared space and acknowledges that property owners will resolve disputes of shared usage between themselves.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Must have some type of barrier between cars and seating spaces, such as: Snow fence, cones with rope or chain, cones, or plastic A-frame barriers.</li> <li>• The temporary space must meet ADA standards:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Guests must have access to restroom facilities.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• A traffic plan should be developed (in a shared parking lot, if traffic is interrupted, how is it managed?).</li> <li>• If business has a liquor license an updated insurance certificate identifying newly expanded premises on file with the City.</li> <li>• Tents are not permitted.</li> </ul>
City Sidewalks	City On-street Parking Spaces or Public Parking Lots
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tables and chairs are allowed provided 48" clear space must be maintained between the tables and the edge of the sidewalk.</li> <li>• Temporary space must be as close to the business entrance as possible.</li> <li>• Neighboring restaurants/bars are encouraged to create a common shared space where possible (to minimize the number of ramps needed for ADA accessibility).               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Each space must be designated for each restaurant/bar.</li> <li>○ Must follow current state occupancy regulations available on the Stay Safe MN Website.</li> <li>○ If a common space is created, the business owners must submit written plan, signed by all owners, that describes the proposed shared space and acknowledges that property owners will resolve disputes of shared usage between themselves.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Temporary space must meet ADA standards:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Guests must have access to restroom facilities.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Copy of insurance certificate identifying the identifying newly expanded premises on file with the City.</li> <li>• Must have some type of barrier between cars and seating spaces (not including sidewalk), such as: Snow fence, planters with rope or chain, cones with rope or chain, or plastic A-frame barriers. The City will provide this to the business.</li> <li>• Refundable damage deposit of \$250 to be paid to City.</li> <li>• Tents are not permitted.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• May use up to 4 parking spaces for each business (public lots) or 2 parallel parking spaces or 3 angle parking spaces per business.</li> <li>• Temporary space must be as close to the business entrance as possible.</li> <li>• Neighboring restaurants/bars are encouraged to create a common shared space where possible (to minimize the number of ramps needed for ADA accessibility).               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Each space must be designated for each restaurant/bar.</li> <li>○ If a common space is created, the business owners must submit written plan, signed by all owners, that describes the proposed shared space and acknowledges that property owners will resolve disputes of shared usage between themselves.</li> <li>○ Must follow current state occupancy regulations available on the Stay Safe MN Website.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Temporary space must meet ADA standards:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Guests must have access to restroom facilities.</li> <li>○ A ramp, with a 2% slope, must be provided from the sidewalk to the parking with a handrail on ramp.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Copy of insurance certificate identifying the identifying newly expanded premises on file with the City.</li> <li>• Must have some type of barrier between cars and seating spaces, such as: Snow fence, cones with rope or chain, cones, or plastic A-frame barriers which designate the temporary space. The City will provide this to the businesses.</li> <li>• Refundable damage deposit of \$250 to be paid to City.</li> <li>• Tents are not permitted.</li> </ul>
